at the end of the 2019/20 period and clearly had
a huge impact on all of us. I would like to thank
residents for their patience and cooperation
throughout these difficult months.

Throughout this report, we've highlighted some key achievements, along with some future plans to continually improve. Much of our concentration now and going forward is to ensure your homes are as sustainable and as 'green' as possible. Not only will this help Eastbourne Borough Council's move towards a significant carbon reduction, after both Lewes District Council and Eastbourne Borough Council declared climate emergencies, but it will also lower fuel bills for tenants and ensure your homes and environment are part of a 'cleaner' future.

This will be an on-going programme over the next decade and future communications will

update you as to what this will mean to you all in the future.

We are also now, as part of our Tenant Involvement Strategy, looking at new ways to get as many of you participating in shaping future services. Traditionally, we have carried this out by speaking to people faceto-face, but at present this is being compromised by the pandemic. With that in mind, we have recently launched something we have called the 'Virtual 300' which takes this into account by enabling tenants to engage with the Council online. This does not mean that we have ceased all other types of involvement, but clearly we have had to recognise the different circumstance we are now in. I hope you enjoy this second calendarstyle report. As always we welcome your feedback on this and any other issues you wish to discuss around your home and Council Services.

Residents Voice, which represents tenants from each of the Area Panels, worked with us over the period to:

- Consider Homes First performance across Eastbourne.
- Consider changes proposed to service delivery repairs.
- Involve more tenants in local decision making and opening up membership of Residents Voice.
- Agree our approach to the scrutiny process.
- Programme and deliver estate walkabouts.
- Ask questions of the Senior Management team.
- Help to review publications and policies.

86% of you said you were satisfied with the opportunities we offer to enable you to get involved.

How do we know?

We use the HouseMark Survey of Tenants and Residents (STAR) system to analyse satisfaction.

The system is also used to gather feedback and comment on all our service areas.

During the period April 2019 - March 2020 we investigated and resolved **60** issues that tenants had made us aware of in their STAR feedback surveys.

We know that tenants have busy lives and we want to make use of modern technology to make it as easy as possible for tenants to contribute

To do this, we will:

- Develop the use of modern technology to give as many tenants as possible the chance to share and express their views, contributing to shaping and improving services.
- Develop the Virtual 300 database of involved tenants to support consultation and involvement activities.
- Improve our approach to promoting, measuring and reporting the impact of involvement through the use of specialist software.

Did you know...?

Area Panels have a budget of £40,000 – Community Improvement Budget. The criteria for applications was revised this year to support Eastbourne communities to meet some of the challenges that have arisen due to COVID-19, such as: mental wellbeing, finding work, loneliness, financial hardship, virtual IT connections and training, and children's education.

Did you know...?

Phase two of the work to remove diseased trees that have been left dead or dying by ash dieback will commence in Upper Dukes Drive in Meads, behind Longland Road and around Pashley Down Infant School Old Town.

By removing the dead timber, new sunlit glades and small meadows are being created that will benefit insects and chalk grassland species. Old dew ponds will be reawakened as a water source for wildlife, while the natural woodland will be regenerated by some targeted replanting with mixed species.

The **Homes Standard** looks at how we provide homes that are safe, good quality and well maintained.

84% of you were satisfied with the standard of repairs that we carried out.

86% of tenants were satisfied with the overall quality of their home.

95.78% of homes meet the Decent Homes Standard.

Did you know...?

We completed **9819** responsive repairs, of which **2539** were emergency, **580** urgent and **5724** routine.

We also completed **29** replacement kitchens and **37** bathrooms.

The average amount spent on responsive repairs per property was £463.80. The average amount spent on planned improvements per property was £1376.

Did you know...?

Last year the scrutiny team decided to examine the communal repairs service as a result of feedback from the STAR survey. The process started with a desk top review which looked at data and procedures, and this was followed by reality checks and interviews with tenants and officers. The evidence gathered was examined closely by the team who produced a report with a series of recommendations, many of which were adopted to help improve the repairs service and help in the development of our new portal for tenants.

Future plans

We are developing an in-house project management team headed by an Asset and Capital Works manager who will lead a team of three qualified surveyors and two clerks of works. The team will manage our investment programme to achieve savings for the Councils and leaseholders.

We have commissioned a stock condition survey of all homes managed by Homes First. The information we have is incomplete and we need to know the existing condition of kitchens, bathrooms and other building fabric components so we can sensibly plan for the future and get our priorities right.

FFT (Faithorn Farrell Timms) are contacting all Eastbourne Homes tenants to assess the condition of our housing stock. Everyone will receive a letter letting them know when the surveyor plans to call. All surveyors carry photo ID and will observe a social distancing and sanitising protocol that we have agreed with them.

During 2019-2020 we let **110** general needs homes.

These consisted of **1** studio apartment, **54** one-bedroom flats, **32** two-bedroom flats, **20** three-bedroom flats and **3** three-bedroom houses

We also let **26** retirement housing properties made up of **6** studios, **12** one-bed flats and **8** two-bedroom flats.

We helped **8** tenants to mutually exchange property through HomeSwapper (the UK's leading exchange service for tenants). The average number of days taken to re-let our empty properties was **55.54** days.

Homeless Applications

We actively assisted 829 households homeless or at risk of homelessness in 2019/20 by providing advice and assistance, producing personal housing plans, sign-posting to services and in some instances offering loans.

The outcome of every application is different depending on what the need is, but we successfully enabled 149 households to remain in existing accommodation or find a new property, and another 288 households were relieved from homelessness by the local authority taking reasonable steps to help the applicant secure suitable accommodation for at least six months.

The remaining 437 households had a Main Housing Duty decision (i.e. they were provided temporary accommodation until this duty ended) or if owed Full Housing Duty they were offered temporary accommodation until settled accommodation could be identified. The others were found to have No Local Connection, Not in Priority Need, Not Eligible or Intentionally Homeless.

Did you know...?

Did you know - the Rough Sleepers Initiative (RSI) in Eastbourne helps people get off the street and break the cycles of dependency that keep them there. Since RSI started in 2018, verified rough sleeping numbers in Eastbourne have dropped from 40 to 4. The RSI provides work with nurses, mental health practitioners, adult social care, intensive floating support, probation, substance misuse and the Department of Work and Pensions.



Future improvement plans

HomeSwapper is a popular way for our customers to find a suitable exchange. We will be adding SwapTracker to the website to help our tenants during the mutual exchange process.

SwapTracker
has an easy to use, mobile
friendly form that can be
submitted to Homes First online.
The system gives updates and
notifications throughout
the process which helps to
improve transparency. It also
allows for document sharing,
reducing the need to post or
deliver paperwork.

We believe SwapTracker will help Homes First provide an improved service and reduce the need for face-to-face contact.

Did you know...?

The emergency pull cords in retirement housing schemes, together with the pendant or wrist band provided, are connected to an alarm unit to assist you in cases of emergencies.

Should you feel unwell or suffer a fall, you simply press the button or pull the cord and it will connect through to the contact centre who will respond directly to you via a loudspeaker into your property.

The response team will ask few questions, assess the situation and take the appropriate action. This might be to contact a Retirement Housing Advisor, calling your emergency contact or if they establish a need, they will contact the emergency services on your behalf.





Did you know...

Eastbourne Council has its own Open Spaces Team who look after the seafront displays as well as five parks and gardens in Eastbourne: Hampden Park, Old Town Recreation Ground, Princes Park, Gildredge Park and Manor Gardens, and Meads Parks and Gardens

86% of tenants are satisfied with their neighbourhood as a place to live.

We now have a new asset management team who will be reviewing the results of our stock condition surveys and then making improvements across the district.

Did you know...?

The tenancy management team helped to resolve **230** cases of anti-social behaviour (ASB) in Eastbourne last year. The team completed **40** Hate and ASB Risk assessments (HARA), made **57** safeguarding referrals and were involved in **64** Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conferences.

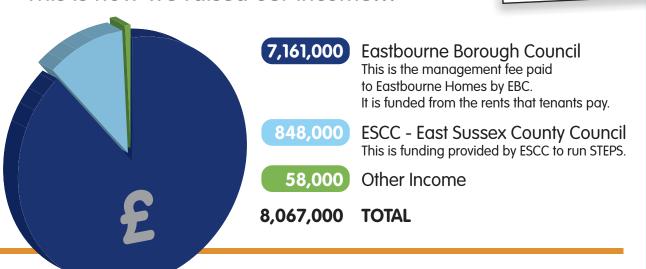

Future plans

Over the next three years a mixture of council rented and shared ownership affordable homes will be built on Bedfordwell Road within the new development around The Pump House.

Two new housing schemes in Eastbourne also recently received planning consent. **12** Modular Homes (built in stages in a factory and assembled together on site) will be delivered on Langney Road and a further **19** apartments in a five-storey building will be developed on the old car park in Southfields Road next to the Post Office.

How are we doing?

We collected **95.67%** of rent.

94% of tenants think that their rent represents good value for money.

The average weekly rent for an Eastbourne Homes property is **£77.30** (this is the average for all properties from bedsits to five bed houses).

The average weekly rent for properties rented in the private rented sector in Eastbourne Borough is £220 per week (Office for National Statistics).

We have an active retirement housing forum in Eastbourne where representatives from each retirement housing scheme meet to discuss matters that affect all retirement housing residents such as cleaning, gardening, and new policies for retirement housing.

The Chairs of both the Eastbourne Homes and Lewes District retirement forum are in regular contact.

The Tenant Involvement team are working with retirement housing representatives who are interested in developing their computer skills to get online and participate virtually by providing training and computers.

Tenant Involvement and Empowerment (TIE) Panel – TIE members work with senior managers to discuss issues affecting tenants across Lewes District and Eastbourne, to make sure that tenant interests are fully considered in all aspects of strategic decision making. They also oversee the work of our tenant scrutiny team.

Tenant Scrutiny Team – Tenant Scrutiny members are trained to carry out in-depth reviews of a service area, such as repairs and complaints monitoring. The scrutiny team makes evidence-based recommendations that the Homes First Senior Leadership Team use to agree on improvements.

Area Panels – There are four area panels in Eastbourne which meet monthly. As well as discussing housing issues, Area Panels focus on supporting the community through allocating their community improvement budgets and running community events such as Christmas Fayres or cream teas. The Area Panels are always looking for new members and in particular in Old Town; which due to the retirement of members has temporarily stopped meeting (their funding allocation is currently being managed by the other panels).

Retirement Housing Forum – If you live in a retirement housing scheme, you can act as a representative to discuss the views and specific needs of tenants living at the scheme.

Tenants' Conference - Homes First run annual events such as the Tenants' Conference where you can be updated on our services, meet staff and network with other tenants.

Mystery Shoppers – We train tenants to test our services to make sure we are delivering them in line with agreed standards.

Surveys/Questionnaires – We send surveys by post, text, email or telephone so we can find out what you think of our services.

Quality Checkers – Are tenant volunteers who complete specific quality checks on services such as cleaning and grounds maintenance, this approach is currently being piloted in retirement housing.



Virtual 300 - Share your views and ideas on specific topics by engaging in a virtual community online – all from the comfort of home.

Communications Panel – The communications panel is made up of tenants whose job is to make sure that published information like this report is jargon free and easy to read and understand.

Estate walkabouts – We propose to target areas where there are local issues, such as planned maintenance or anti-social behaviour, and tenants living in the area are then notified and invited to join our staff to give us their views.

Focus Groups – Tenants can join an informal but structured chat with others to share views on a specific area.
