## Remembering the holocaust

More than 100 people attended Eastbourne's Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) event at the Town Hall, hosted by Eastbourne's Faiths Forum.

The event, which focused on the national HMD theme 'How can life go on?', proved to be a thought-provoking and moving experience for audience members as they listened to poems, prayers, presentations and accounts read out by members of Eastbourne's Faiths Forum and others.

Dorit Oliver-Wolff spoke about being a five-year-old Jewish girl living in Hungary during the holocaust.

The event was opened by the Mayor of Eastbourne and part of the evening was dedicated to the current refugee crisis with Eastbourne's MP, Caroline Ansell, and Anna Reid, Chair of Networx – a local ecumenical group supporting Syrian refugees – giving personal accounts of their experiences locally and overseas.

Eastbourne's Faiths Champion, Carolyn Heaps, said that it was pleasing to hear that Eastbourne residents were welcoming Syrian families into their town with open arms, helping to make a desperate situation more tolerable. She also recognised that there was still a lot more to do.

### **CCTV** leads to crime reduction

A community camera scheme which was the brainchild of Hampden Park & Willingdon Trees Area Panel members has helped lead to a reduction in crime.

Panel members suggested the launch of a community camera last year, in their bid for a cleaner and safer environment for residents, shoppers and shops. A fixed camera was placed in Brassey Parade and reports show this has led to 25% fewer crimes being reported, according to www.police.uk Two further cameras were funded by all four Area Panels. They are managed by Eastbourne Borough Council and used throughout the town.

# **Homes First:**Joint Transformation update

Eastbourne Borough Council, Eastbourne Homes Ltd and Lewes District Council are working together to share services.

Last year, both councils approved the 'Joint Transformation Programme' (JTP). This means we will work together to create shared teams to deliver services across Lewes and Eastbourne.

The two councils face huge financial challenges:

Combined budgets are currently £28.9m

Due to central government funding cuts, this will reduce by £6.6m (23%) by 2020

This is not a merger of the two councils. Each 'sovereign body' will continue to have its own budgets, councillors and committee meetings governing the work of its own organisation. Eastbourne Homes will retain its Board of Directors who will continue to meet quarterly.

Tenants and leaseholders will continue to be tenants and leaseholders of Eastbourne Borough Council (managed by Eastbourne Homes) and Lewes District Council as they are now and their tenancy conditions will not change. A working group of Eastbourne and Lewes tenant representatives and staff and councillors from Eastbourne Borough Council, Eastbourne Homes and Lewes District Council was set up in November 2016 to explore what this might mean for current and future tenants of Eastbourne Homes and Lewes District Council, and to agree the principles of sharing housing management services. This ensures that residents have their say.

New ways of working and integrating our housing teams will deliver a total saving of £500,000. This equates to a saving of nearly 20% on the current total cost of just over £2.5m.

lan Fitzpatrick, Managing Director of Eastbourne Homes, said: "Bringing teams together is one way to protect services to residents while reducing costs. Bringing policies and procedures in line helps us to be more efficient. Making best use of modern technology to allow customers to do more online and our staff to work closer to communities is also part of this programme."

# Consultations on new housing policies

Eastbourne Borough Council and Eastbourne Homes have been working with Lewes District Council to look at how we can provide a single housing service for both Eastbourne and Lewes.

As part of this we are looking at our policies to see if they can be made consistent and brought up to date. This will enable our staff to work more effectively and efficiently across both areas.

Our Housing Allocations Policy explains who is eligible to join the Council's Housing Register and how applications are prioritised. It is of interest to everyone with a local connection to Eastbourne who has a housing need and wishes to apply for social rented housing in Eastbourne, or transfer to another home. The policy is for those with the most urgent housing needs and includes information on how to apply to join the Housing Register and how to bid for a home.

Our Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Policy outlines how we prevent, respond to and manage reports of ASB from our residents and tenants. ASB covers a wide range of unacceptable activity and can affect the quality of life of communities and disrupt the lives of many residents. The national definition of ASB is behaviour "that caused or was likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more persons not of the same household," and can include:

Vehicle nuisance or inappropriate use Rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour Nuisance neighbours Littering Street drinking

This consultation does not cover the procedure for investigating ASB as this is outlined in each council's own procedure and will remain separate. A copy of our ASB procedure is available on request. People are invited to comment on the proposed changes to these policies between 5th May and 16th June. For more information on the changes and to make your comments, visit the Council's webpage and search for consultations. Your feedback will help us ensure that the Council's policies respond to the needs of its residents and communities.

# Asset and capital works Facelift for

Rush Court



Rush Court is a multi-storey block owned by Eastbourne Borough Council and managed by Eastbourne Homes which consists of 24 flats occupied by both tenants and long leaseholders.

Eastbourne Homes undertakes a cycle of routine re-decoration and maintenance works to all blocks we manage and, as part of this, Rush Court had a makeover.

A variety of works were undertaken by our appointed building contractor John Farrington & Co Ltd and contract managed by GD Surveyors Ltd.

The internal and external repairs have significantly improved the overall appearance of the building and the reaction from residents, the general public and Eastbourne Homes' staff has been extremely positive. Many believe the works will improve the lives of our residents, increase the attractiveness of the leasehold assets and have a wider positive impact on Bourne Street and the surrounding local area.



# Rental reduction is good news for residents

Eastbourne Borough Council follows the government's guidance regarding rents for social housing.

The Welfare Reform and Work Act 2016 requires rents on social housing properties to be reduced by 1% per year for four years from 2016–17.

For 2017/18, Eastbourne Borough Council Cabinet has recommended to full council that the rents for social and affordable housing are decreased by 1%.

You will have received a letter to advise you of the new rent for your property from 3rd April 2017. If you pay a service charge for communal areas, water, heating or council tax, your letter will include the new charges for these items,

too. The letter does not include any Housing Benefit that you are entitled to.

If you receive Housing Benefit, we will let you know how much rent you will need to pay. If you have any questions about your rent or Housing Benefit, or if you feel that the increase will cause you problems, please call 01323 410000 or visit 1 Grove Road, Eastbourne, BN21 4TW.

If you rent a garage from Eastbourne Homes, we have recommended to full council that your garage rent does not increase this year. This means that your garage rent will stay the same as last year.

### Pay your rent the easy way – set up a Direct Debit today!

Direct Debits are an easy, simple and convenient way to pay your rent or service charges. It means that:

You no longer have to worry about paying your rent or service charges on time

You no longer need to make a special journey to pay your rent or service charges

Direct Debit is Eastbourne Homes' preferred method of paying rent and service charges. By choosing to pay by Direct Debit, you are helping Eastbourne Homes to save money. It's cheaper to process a Direct Debit than a cash or card payment and these savings are used to improve resident services.

We offer:

Monthly Direct Debits (taken on the 1st of every month)

Fortnightly (taken on the Monday of every rent paying fortnight)

Weekly (taken on the Monday of every rent paying week)

Either download a form from www.eastbournehomes.org.uk or contact us on 01323 410000 and ask us to set up a Direct Debit.

If you don't have a bank account, you can find out about the different types of account available from any bank or building society, or from a website such as www.moneyadviceservice.com

If for any reason you cannot have a bank account, you need to talk to us as soon as possible so that we can make alternative arrangements for you to pay your rent.


# Fire safety visits

East Sussex Fire & Rescue is working with Eastbourne Homes to help people to stay safe in their properties.

One of the ways we do this is by providing a Home Safety visit to people who are most at risk from fires. Specially trained staff will visit your home and give you advice on how to reduce the risk of having a fire.

At first contact you will be asked a range of questions to see if you qualify for a visit, or to receive a safety pack. We are also able to arrange specialist equipment for disabilities such as vibrating pads or lights for deaf residents, and can signpost to the Occupational Therapy team if necessary.
