

## **Your Top Tips**

- White vinegar is great for cleaning and disinfecting household items, appliances, and windows. (Do not use on stone, granite, hardwood or for egg stains.)
- Sign up to Martin Lewis –
   Money Saving Expert for advice and deals:

- Visit the Library in the winter to keep warm, and use the computers for free.
- Use cashback sites like Quidco and Topcashback on all online purchases. (Note: Martin Lewis says: "Focus on the cheapest deal not the biggest cashback".)



• Turn off all appliances (such as microwave, TV, games console) when not in use –

don't leave them on standby.

 Only boil as much water as you need in the kettle.






 Use LED lightbulbs and not halogen lightbulbs. LED bulbs can last five times longer

and use 80% less energy to produce the same amount of light.



- Smart Meters show how much energy is being used and how much it is costing you.
- Make your own radiator panels:
   Use a large sheet of
   cardboard cut to the size
   of the radiator. Cover the
   card in tin foil using
   sticky backed tape.
   Slide the cover behind
   the radiator, pressing
   the top and bottom
   to the wall.
- A survival sheet or a sleeping bag can be placed under your bed covers to keep you warm at night.

- Frosted up fridges and freezers are expensive to run – defrost them when needed.
- Close curtains and blinds at dusk to keep heat in.
- Turn off radiators in rooms you are not using.



 Invest in a Hand Cranking Generator to charge electronic items. These are available to buy at many online marketplaces.

• Fill the kettle once a day and put the boiled water in a vacuum flask, so you have instant hot water for hot drinks, not usi



water for hot drinks, not using any extra electricity or waiting for the kettle to boil.

## Food for thought...

### **Food Waste and Recipe Apps**

- Change4Life Smart Recipe App: tasty, healthy and budget meals.
- OLIO App: Share surplus food, give and get free stuff, and borrow and lend household items in your neighbourhood.
- Too Good To Go App:
   For customers to rescue unsold food from shops and restaurants to save it from going to waste.
- **Trolly** App: Compare supermarket prices.

- How to cook and eat well with limited equipment and money – recipe book for microwaves and kettles: Brighton and Hove Food Partnership – 01273 234810
- Swap budget and favourite recipes with friends and neighbours.
- Fry up left-over potatoes and vegetable to make 'Bubble and Squeak'. Try topping with a poached or fried egg for a complete meal.
- Make jam or crumbles with foraged fruit. (Only take a small amount and leave some for the birds and wildlife!).

- Freeze fruit if you have too much, (for example strawberries in June, apples in September).
- Find out if there is a community garden in your area to grow food with others.
- If you are an allotment holder or vegetable growing – donate excess vegetables to your community larder or local foodbank (see next page).
- Grow strawberries in hanging baskets to prevent slug damage.
- Adding lots of vegetables to curries and stews makes the meat go further and adds vitamins. For an even cheaper dish, use lentils instead of meat (see our cover recipe!)
- A slow cooker uses the same amount of energy as a light bulb so is a cheap way to cook food.
- If you have a communal lounge or kitchen, cook as shared lunch or dinner to save on fuel and ingredients. NOTE: Level 2 Food hygiene training is needed to cook in communal lounges.

- Supermarket own brands are just as tasty, but much cheaper!
- Sell by dates are confusing "Use By" is the date to follow

- Casserole packs makes a good value soup.
- Use Tupperware and old takeaway pots to freeze food
- Batch cooking can save on cooking costs. Batch-cooked meals can be frozen or shared with neighbours or friends.

### Grants and Funds...

### The Household Support Grant and Cost of Living Emergency Fund

- Eastbourne residents will receive £250 and Lewes residents will receive £650 to their bank account (the award is limited to one application per household).
- Eligibility: 18+ years old and in receipt of Housing Benefit and/or Council Tax reduction but not in receipt of any other means tested benefits; struggling to pay for heating, lighting, water bills or food and have a capital of below £6,000.

## Discretionary Housing Payment (DHP)

- Eligibility: Getting Universal Credit housing element or Housing Benefit and struggling to pay the rent. You don't have to repay a DHP!

### **Cost of Living Payment**

There are three different types of payment, depending upon your circumstances:

- Cost of Living Payment of £650 paid in two instalments, if you get a qualifying low-income benefit, including Universal Credit, Pension Credit and Tax Credits.
- An additional Cost of Living Payment of £900 will be issued in 2023-24.
- Disability Cost of Living Payment of £150, if you get a qualifying disability benefit. A further £150 Disability Cost of Living Payment will be issued in 2023-24.
- Pensioner Cost of Living Payment –
   if you're entitled to a Winter Fuel
   Payment for winter 2022 to 2023,
   you will get an extra £300. An
   additional £300 Cost of Living
   Payment will be given to pensioners
   in 2023-24. Payments will be paid
   automatically in two instalments,
   one in summer and another in the
   autumn, and is in addition to the
   £400 discount on energy bills.

#### **Warm Home Discount Scheme**

- You can get £150 discount off your electricity bill if: your energy supplier is part of the scheme and you get pension credit guarantee or have a low income.

### **Energy Bill Support Scheme**

 All households will receive a £400 non-repayable discount this autumn which will be paid in six instalments.

 Households will see a discount of £66 applied to their energy bills in October and November, and £67 a month from December to March 2023.  All customers with a domestic electricity meter who pay by direct debit or by card will see an automatic deduction off their bills. Those with 'smart' prepayment devices will see an automatic monthly top-up added to their account.

### **Cold Weather Payments**

- If the average temperature in your area is recorded or forecast as below freezing for at least a week, you could automatically be paid £25 extra a week cold weather payment.
- To qualify, you must get either pension credit or a low-income benefit and someone in your home is under 5, pension age or disabled.

# British Gas Energy Trust is currently providing two funds

- Individuals and Families Fund (no need to be customer of British Gas.
- British Gas Energy Support Fund (for British Gas customers who have not received a grant in the past 12 months).
- The funds will cover debt arrears of up to £1,500 by crediting the householder account.
- Applicants to either fund must have received support from a Money Advice organisation – for example, Citizens Advice or Brighton Housing Trust.
- Proof of income is required to determine whether a household is in or at risk of fuel poverty.

#### **Warm Home Check Service**

- Eligibility: low income, or living with a long-term condition or disability or in receipt of Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit, Universal Credit, Pension Guarantee Credit or Pension Savings Credit, Income Support, Income based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) or Income Related Support Allowance (ESA).

#### **Disabled Facilities Grants**

- Eligibility: If you're disabled and need to make changes or adaptations to your home.
- A Disabled Facilities Grant won't affect any benefits you get!
- Call Adult Social Care Direct on 0345 6080 191, or call the East Sussex County Council switchboard on 0345 608 0190 to request an Assessment.

## **Transfer Incentive Scheme** (TIS)

- For social tenants with a bedroom tax and who have held a secure tenancy for at least one year can enter the scheme. Tenants who give up larger accommodation may be eligible for cash incentives that may clear their rent arrears.



### Tax Allowances...

#### **Marriage Allowance**

- Allows you to transfer £1,260 of your Personal Allowance to your husband, wife or civil partner. This reduces your tax by up to £252 in the tax year.
  - Eligibility: you are married or in a civil partnership and you do not pay Income Tax or your income is below your Personal Allowance (usually £12,570), your partner pays Income Tax at the basic rate, which usually means their income is between £12,571 and £50,270 before they receive Marriage Allowance

#### **Tax-Free Childcare**

- Up to £500 every three months (up to £2,000 a year) for each of your children to help with the costs of childcare. This goes up to £1,000 every three months if a child is disabled (up to £4,000 a year). Eligibility criteria apply.
