This statement sets out **East Sussex's** flexible eligibility criteria for the Energy Company Obligation (ECO4) scheme from April 2022 – March 2026. As permitted in the BEIS guidance on flexible eligibility local authorities in East Sussex delegate functions for identifying eligible households in its area to Hastings Borough Council.

The ECO4 scheme will focus on supporting low income and vulnerable households. The scheme will improve the least energy efficient homes helping to meet the Government's fuel poverty and net zero commitments.

The flexible approach for Local Authorities (LAs) to identifying fuel poor and vulnerable households who may benefit from heating and energy saving measures is referred to as "ECO4 Flex".

The Councils welcome the introduction of the ECO4 Flex eligibility routes as it helps the Councils achieve their plans to improve the homes of those in fuel poverty or vulnerable to the cold.

The Councils are publishing this Statement of Intent (SoI), on the **17/10/2022** to confirm that each of the households declared will adhere to at least one of the three available routes outlined below:

**Route 1:** SAP bands D-G households with an income less than £31,000. This cap applies irrespective of the property size, composition, or region.

Route 2: SAP bands E-G households that meet a combination of two of the following proxies:

**Proxy 1)** Homes in the three most deprived Lower-layer Super Output Area (LSOA) deciles (1-3) of the English Indices of Deprivation 2019<sup>1</sup>

**Proxy 2)** Householders receiving a Council Tax rebate (rebates based on low income only, excludes single person rebates).

**Proxy 3)** Householders vulnerable to living in a cold home as identified in the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) Guidance<sup>2</sup>. Only one from the list can be used, excludes the proxy 'low income'.

**Proxy 4)** A householder receiving free school meals due to low-income.

**Proxy 5)** A householder supported by the East Sussex Warm Home Check service (<a href="www.eastsussex.gov.uk/keepwarm">www.eastsussex.gov.uk/keepwarm</a>) which supports low income and vulnerable households to keep warm and well at home (a single-point-of-contact health and housing referral service for East Sussex residents, as described in NICE Guideline NG6).

**Proxy 6)** A household referred to an East Sussex local authority for support by their energy supplier or Citizens Advice, because they have been identified as struggling to pay their electricity and gas bills.

**Route 3:** SAP bands D-G households that have been identified by their doctor or GP as low-income and vulnerable, with an occupant whose health conditions may be impacted further by living in a cold home. These health conditions may be cardiovascular, respiratory, immunosuppressed, or limited mobility related.

This is because the Councils have identified a positive correlation between households who suffer from long-term health conditions and living off a low-income, with living in poorly

insulated homes.

All potentially eligible households should apply through Hastings Borough Council or one of their approved ECO installers to ensure that they can either benefit from the scheme or be

assessed for eligibility under any other relevant programme.
