Vulnerable Household Support Fund Privacy Notice

On 06 March 2024 the government announced a package of support for vulnerable households. The Household Support Fund provides £3,896,783.88 to help vulnerable people in East Sussex, The funds have been provided by the Department of Work and Pensions to East Sussex County Council who have allocated a limited fund to Lewes and Eastbourne Council to support households in the most need with food, energy and water bills.

If you apply, we will need to process your personal data to assess whether you are eligible to receive financial support. This Privacy Notice sets out what personal data we will use, how we will use it, and why we need to, when an applicant applies for this support.

Categories of personal data we collect and process

We collect and process the personal data that you provide to us when completing your application for the Household Support Fund, which may include:

- Full name;
- Full residential address
- Proof of residence
- Email address;
- Proof of means tested benefit
- Telephone number;
- Bank details
- Your National Insurance Number;
- Information regarding children in the household
- Disabilities
- Age

What we use your personal data for

We will carry out checks with the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), for verification purposes,

Information relating to your application will also be sent to East Sussex County Council and DWP to allow us to carry out anti-fraud checks and determine how well the scheme is performing.

Your personal data will only be shared with Councils' third party advice and support partners who will be processing the data only to assess your eligibility for financial assistance and to ensure you receive the assistance you are entitled to. We may disclose information to third parties where it is necessary, either to comply with a legal obligation, or where permitted under data protection laws.

We will not share this data with other organisations or individuals outside of Lewes District Council, Eastbourne Borough Council, East Sussex County Council and the Department of Work and Pensions for any other purpose.

Our lawful basis for processing the personal data

The lawful basis we rely on for using your personal information is:

 UK GDPR Article 6(1)(e) – processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller.

International Data Transfers and Storage

Your data will not be sent or stored abroad.

Personal data disposal and retention

We will only keep your personal data for as long as it is needed for the purposes of determining whether you qualify for assistance under the Scheme, for making payment of your financial entitlement under the scheme and in accordance with the authority's data retention policies.

Your rights as a data subject

By law, you have a number of rights as a data subject and this does not take away or reduce these rights. Your rights under the UK General Data Protection Regulation (2016/679) and the UK Data Protection Act 2018 applies.

All information is processed in accordance with Lewes District Council and Eastbourne Borough Council data protection policy www.lewes-eastbourne.gov.uk/access-to-information/data-protection/

These rights are:

1. Your right to get copies of your information – you have the right to ask for a copy of any information about you that is used.

- 2. Your right to get your information corrected you have the right to ask for any information held about you that you think is inaccurate, to be corrected
- 3. Your right to limit how your information is used you have the right to ask for any of the information held about you to be restricted, for example, if you think inaccurate information is being used.
- 4. Your right to object to your information being used you can ask for any information held about you to not be used. However, this is not an absolute right, and we may need to continue using your information, and we will tell you if this is the case.
- 5. Your right to get information deleted this is not an absolute right, and we may need to continue to use your information, and we will tell you if this is the case.
