I am writing to protest in the <u>strongest</u> possible terms against the above proposals for the following reasons:

Newhaven Town Council has identified that the town of Newhaven has enough potential employment space for the next <u>20 years</u>, and the industrial estate proposed by Policy E1 is not needed. The solution is to attract investment and employment to the already available employment spaces, not to spend our tax payers' money on building more unused or underused warehouses and offices, that will be an eyesore, destroy so much of the natural habitat of flora and fauna, and the enjoyment of all the local people and tourists who daily visit Tide Mills and derive the benefit of unspoilt nature and the beach at the western end.
