# **Executive summary**

In spring and early summer 2022 Eastbourne Borough Council carried out a consultation of two parts to gather views on proposals to introduce a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) to tackle anti-social driving in Eastbourne.

Prior to this, Sussex Police and local residents had identified anti-social driving as an issue of concern in particular areas of the borough.

During both stages of the consultation, there was a high level of support for introducing a PSPO of this nature.

**Part one** of the consultation ran from 14 March to 25 April 2022, during which 89.58% of respondents supported the proposals. Additional roads were also suggested to be included in the order so a second part of the consultation was carried out.

**Part two** of the consultation ran from 27 May to 17 June 2022, during which 96.75% of respondents supported the proposal to include three additional roads in the order.

As a result of the consultation, a recommendation will be made to introduce the order from 1 April and 31 October, each year.

## **Background: what are PSPOs?**

Local authorities have the power to introduce Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) to tackle anti-social behaviour, under legislation set out in section 59 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.

Eastbourne Borough Council has a number of PSPOs currently in place setting out controls on dog fouling and the consumption of alcohol in the town centre. Many other local authorities across England have put PSPOs in place to help control aspects of anti-social driving.

## Consultation: part one

The first part of the consultation took place from 14 March to 25 April 2022, during which we invited views a proposed PSPO which set out a list of prohibited activities most commonly identified in reports of anti-social driving. These activities include the revving of engines, rapid acceleration, racing, excessive noise from vehicles, and off-road activity on public land.

The order would prohibit these activities in 'restricted areas' - those locations where issues of anti-social driving have been reported most often.

The order would be active between the 1 April and 31 October, each year. This is inline with when the issues are most prevalent.

## The restricted areas in the draft order: part one

The draft order consulted on during the initial consultation period listed a number of roads as 'restricted areas'. These are the roads where anti-social behaviour has been most frequently reported:

- Beachy Head Road
- Prince William Parade
- Royal Parade
- Marine Parade
- Grand Parade
- King Edwards Parade
- Dukes Drive
- Upper Dukes Drive
- Warren Hill
- Stretches of East Dean Road
- Seaside
- Seaside Road
- Lottbridge Drove

## **Consultation part two**

There was a high level of support for the proposals during the first part of the consultation, with 89.58% of respondents stating they were in favour of introducing a PSPO to help tackle anti-social driving in Eastbourne. Meanwhile, 78% of respondents stated that they had experienced or been affected by anti-social driving in the proposed restricted areas of Eastbourne.

Part one of the consultation gave an opportunity to state any additional roads respondents felt should be included in the list of restricted areas.

## The restricted areas in the draft order: part two

Three locations, not already on the list of proposed restricted areas, were mentioned most frequently. These were:

- Pacific Drive / Harbour Quay
- Atlantic Drive
- · A section of Pevensey Bay Road

On the advice of Sussex Police the proposals also include Princes Road, in order to bring together the existing and proposed additional restricted areas, comprising of the Seafront Parades and Pevensey Bay Road.

In response we carried out a second stage of the consultation to find out views on proposals to extend the order to cover these additional areas.

Part two of the consultation was carried out from 27 May to 17 June 2022.

## How would the proposed PSPO be enforced?

A person found in breach of the order can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice, and persistent offenders can be prosecuted by the council for breach of the PSPO. Any person found guilty is liable on summary conviction to a fine of up to £1000. Sussex Police will lead the enforcement of the PSPO on behalf of the local authority.

### How we consulted

For the both stages of the consultation we provided an online survey for respondents to complete to share their feedback. We offered paper copies of the survey and also the consultation information in different formats and languages.

We promoted the consultation through social media, on our website, directly by email to all of consultation mailing list subscribers, through the local media and on social media.

## **Headline findings**

We received 970 responses to the first stage of the consultation, which represents a strong rate of response compared with similar consultation exercises. Just over 90% of respondents were Eastbourne residents.

78% of respondents stated that they had experienced or been affected by anti-social driving in the proposed restricted areas of Eastbourne.

There was a high level of support for the proposal, with 89.58% stating they were in favour of introducing a PSPO to help tackle anti- social driving in Eastbourne.

An opportunity was provided to state any additional roads where respondents felt should be included in the list of restricted areas. Of the seven roads mentioned most frequently (more than ten times) four were already on the list. The additional three were:

- Pacific Drive mentioned 77 times
- Atlantic Drive mentioned 51 times
- Pevensey Bay Road mentioned 13 times

Gilbert Road in East Dean was also mentioned frequently (33 times), but this road falls within Wealden and is outside the scope of this consultation.

As a result of this feedback we proposed to extend the area to these three roads in the second part of the consultation.

Part two of the consultation received 235 responses, 96.75% of respondents stating they support the instruction of a PSPO which would also cover the additional roads.
