A street party is a great way to meet your neighbours and build community spirit. It's a relatively easy process.



Here are some helpful hints:

- Involve all ages;
- Cater for people with different tastes and interests;
- Keep it simple and flexible;
- Bring food, games and equipment to share;
- Keep entertainment and any music varied;
- Make sure music is kept low key and at a level so it doesn't cause disruption or annoyance to others;
- Make sure the party doesn't go on too late;
- If you are fundraising, do it on the day, not in advance.

Planning and Consultation

You will need to start planning it as soon as possible, but at least 2 months in advance of the party. Make sure you consult with, and involve:

- Residents and businesses in the street;
- Eastbourne Borough Council, East Sussex Fire and Rescue Service and Sussex Police (and any other relevant organisations);
- Call on the experience of others who have run street parties before, to get ideas and advice.

Road Closure

You will need to apply at least 2 months in advance for permission from East Sussex County Council to close the road.

Think about:

- Alternative traffic routes to minimise disruption;
- Signage to advise people that the event is happening and the road is closed.



Insurance and safety

- Minimise any risks from accidents, damage and prepare for adverse weather conditions;
- Agree in advance that everyone should take responsibility for their own safety and equipment;
- For small scale street parties, Public Liability Insurance may not be required. You will need to investigate this with the council.

Other Permissions and licences

You will not need a Temporary Event Notice if any 'performance' is 'incidental' to the day or 'background,' including recorded music. If you plan to charge for entrance, entertainment or alcohol, you will need to apply for a licence.
